General Guidelines for Growing Great Minds

- ❖ Parents are welcome to attend any class.
- ❖ Register on time. Enrollment is limited and classes fill quickly! Every effort will be made to assign your child into the class of their choice.
- ❖ Students will be enrolled in one (1) class each; with AM classes extra. If there is room in other classes, students may be offered another placement.
- ❖ Please indicate 1st, 2nd and/or 3rd choice on the class form.
- ❖ All 3 forms must be completed and returned for registration.
- ❖ Confirmation of enrollment will be sent home with students the week prior to the start of classes.
- ❖ Discipline: If there is a discipline issue, the child will receive one warning and a call to parents. The second offense will result in the student's removal from all remaining classes for that session.
- ❖ If your child will not attend a class on a particular day, parent/guardian should email Mark Sepnafski at msepnafs@wausauschools.org or send a note to Mr. S. indicating the absence or change in plan. Include child's name, grade and after school class in the note.
- ❖ If your child is signed up for bus transportation, parent/guardian must contact Mr.S. if you plan to pick up your child. Your child will go on the bus if Mr. S. has not received a change notice from the parent or guardian.
- ❖ Dismissal is 4:30 - please be prompt when picking up your child. A financial charge or program dismissal may be incurred for late pick-up.

WSD Elementary Out-of-School Learning Programs Emergency Weather Cancellation Plan

Weather or mechanical breakdowns sometimes require early or emergency dismissal **during** the school day. District-wide emergency dismissals are announced on the television and radio stations listed below.

This Emergency Weather Cancellation Plan addresses those times when there is not an early dismissal and the District has not cancelled all after-school programs, but weather conditions are worsening.

Programs offered by the Out-of-school learning programs may announce cancellation of after-school programs (independent of a District decision) to assure safety of students, staff, and volunteers in its programs at the following schools: Hawthorn Hills, Lincoln, Stettin, Thomas Jefferson, Grant, GD Jones and Riverview. This decision will be announced by **1:00 PM** on television and radio stations listed below and by phone and/or e-mail via School Messenger. (This may precede a District-wide decision.)

If after-school programs must be cancelled, we would like to know that you have made plans for your child(ren). Please complete the form below and return it to your out-of-school Enrichment Coordinator. Discuss the plan with your child/children. It is difficult for students to telephone for instructions at these times, so we will keep a copy of your after-school plan on file. *Please plan ahead to assure the safety of your child and inform us of any changes in this plan. It is the responsibility of parents to be attentive to cancellations and to act accordingly to your child's plan in the event of a cancellation. Children must be picked up promptly at the close of the regular school day if not designated to walk home or ride the bus.*
